

## Whitaker House to launch Blue Time fantasy series Sept. 1

## The Master Song compared to Tolkien's Lord of the Rings



*The Master Song*, first of Andrew Maloney's Blue Time series, is scheduled to release September 1, 2014. Written in the vein of *The Chronicles of Narnia* by C. S. Lewis and *The Lord of the Rings* by J. R. R. Tolkien, this high-fantasy fiction tale is aimed at the genre's wide fan base, from young teens to adults.

"The Master Song is the closest thing I have yet to find that approaches the magic, depth, and wonder of the Lord of the Rings trilogy," said Jeffrey D. Shaffer, author, editor, and English professor (Shizuoka University, Japan). "The characters are real and believable; the story, though fantastic, never pulls any annoying 'amazing coincidences.' What more could you ask from a master storyteller? And this is exactly what we have in Andrew Maloney."

Whitaker House President Bob Whitaker Jr. said he is "elated" with Maloney's Blue Time series and the tremendous response *The Master Song* is receiving, not only from early reviews, but also from in-house staff—editors, proofreaders, and graphic artists—preparing the book for print.

"With such a big demand for fantasy books in recent years, we've received a number of proposals and manuscripts but didn't want to jump into the genre unless we found the right book—something fresh and unique, a well-written book by a solid Christian author," Whitaker said. Maloney says the Blue Time series is an "epic high-fantasy adventure with a huge cast of characters and unique locations," but that it also incorporates "key virtues and weaknesses and cultural issues without being overtly allegorical or religious."


"There are Christian themes and poignant truths," Maloney said, "but the story is written for the story's sake, and can be enjoyed by mainstream readers as well as Christians."
